

Eleventh Public Board of Directors Meeting September 19, 2017

CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. and the Board Chair welcomed those in attendance.

Director Grimmer commented on a tremendous start up to a new school year.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Rezoning and Transitions Update
 Director Grimmer reported that there are 19,000 + kindergarten to Grade 12 students started back to school in September. There seemed to be a very positive mood in schools. Students were greeted by well prepared and welcoming school staffs.

Last spring, there were approximately 7,500 letters sent to students regarding changes to school zones. Approximately 1,200 students were impacted by rezoning.

Student populations are changing and increasing as families move throughout and into the province. These numbers can change daily. An official enrollment number will be available at the end of September.

To support transitions, there was increased public awareness about the government's back-to-school web page and Public Schools Branch website that provided helpful information.

2. Staffing Update

There are 1430.35 full time equivalent teaching positions in the Public Schools Branch. Approximately 65 new teaching positions have been filled this year. We have 15 first time teachers hired with fixed term contracts.

3. School Renovations

More than \$100,000 was invested in schools where enrolment increased. Investments included additional computers, furniture and equipment, and paving. A considerable amount of maintenance took place over the summer in many schools. Most notably, asbestos ceiling tile abatement was completed at East Wiltshire Intermediate School and Queen Elizabeth Elementary School. Major renovation and construction work is continuing at Three Oaks Senior High School.

4. French Immersion

More than 375 Island students are participating in French Immersion programs at West Kent Elementary and Birchwood Intermediate schools this year. Classrooms were prepared, materials ordered and teachers hired to welcome 145 new Early French Immersion students at West Kent Elementary, and 232 new Continuing and Late French Immersion students at Birchwood Intermediate.

5. Transition Update

Public Schools Branch is monitoring bus routes to ensure things are working as smoothly as possible. We appreciate the patience of students and parents as these routines are established.

It is important that students travel on the bus that they have been assigned. We are asking parents to ensure schools have the most up to date address information so that transporting their children can be done in the most efficient manner.

We have also worked to ensure plans are in place to re-route buses impacted by the construction work in September and October at the Queens Arms intersection in Charlottetown.



6. Branch Directed Professional Development Day

The PSB was responsible for delivering branch directed professional development to some of our staff on September 5 and 6. Training included:

8. Good Things Happening In Island Schools

Hockeyville

The community of O'Leary was recently voted as the winner of Kraft Hockeyville 2017. Hockeyville committee invited students from the Westisle Family of Schools to attend the Hockeyville game day practice on September 25.

 Since it began in 2013, many schools throughout the country have included Orange Shirt Day in their calendar of events. Participation in this day is an opportunity for teachers and students to bring awareness of residential schools and is also an invitation to reconciliation.

STUDENT WELLBEING PROGRAM

Julia Gaudet, Director of Student Services, presented a report on Student Well-Being Program, (SWBP) supporting children, youth and families to reach their full potential.

In the spring of 2016 the DEELC initiated a review of mental health services for students in the Montague, Westisle and Colonel Gray Families of Schools.

The SWBP includes Core Services Teams known as Student Well Being Teams, and will expand access for students to occupational Therapy services; establish a West Prince A+site; enhance MAST to include broader service range and increased accountability and advance staff and community awareness for existing programs and services. Each team will consist of: Two comprehensive school health nurses, one mental health social worker, two youth outreach workers and one counselling consultant.

UPDATE ON INFRASTRUCTURE

The proposed request for funding in the upcoming capital budget from the Province of Prince Edward Island was presented to the Board of Directors by John Cummings. Mr. Cummings requested additional funding to our existing budget for the following projects: Addition to Stratford Elementary School, Addition to West Royalty Elementary School, Addition to LM Montgomery Elementary School and a new build for Sherwood Elementary School.
