## ***Legislation, Mandate, and Commissioners***

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The Commission's authority arises from a 1994 amendment to the *Legislative Assembly Act*, which established the independent Indemnities and Allowances Commission to review the remuneration and benefits of MLAs and parliamentary leaders, and to report its decisions to the Speaker.

The Commission has reviewed the *Pension Plan for Members of the Legislative Assembly*, and included its decisions in this report.

The Commissioners appointed by Honourable Carolyn Bertram, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, are Barbara Stevenson, Q.C., Chair; Stan MacPherson, FCA; and Ronald Profit, Q.C.

## ***Decisions***

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The Commission has concluded, based on an extensive review of the benefits provided by, and the future sustainability of, the *Pension Plan for Members of the Legislative Assembly*, to introduce the following changes to the Plan design:

- 1) The Required Contributions of Plan Participants will increase by 1%, from 8% to 9%, effective the first full pay period of April, 2014.
- 2) Effective January 1, 2015, indexation (pre- and post-retirement) for Plan Participants will no longer be guaranteed. Effective January 1, 2015, indexation will be provided at the same level as provided in the *Civil Service Superannuation Act*.
- 3) The accrual rate on Supplementary Plan benefits will be reduced by 0.5%, effective for service after the commencement of the 65<sup>th</sup> General Assembly.
- 4) Eligibility for a new Plan Participant to receive an unreduced pension will increase by two year's service, effective after the commencement of the 65<sup>th</sup> General Assembly.

An amended full Plan Text, incorporating these changes, will be submitted to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly when available.
